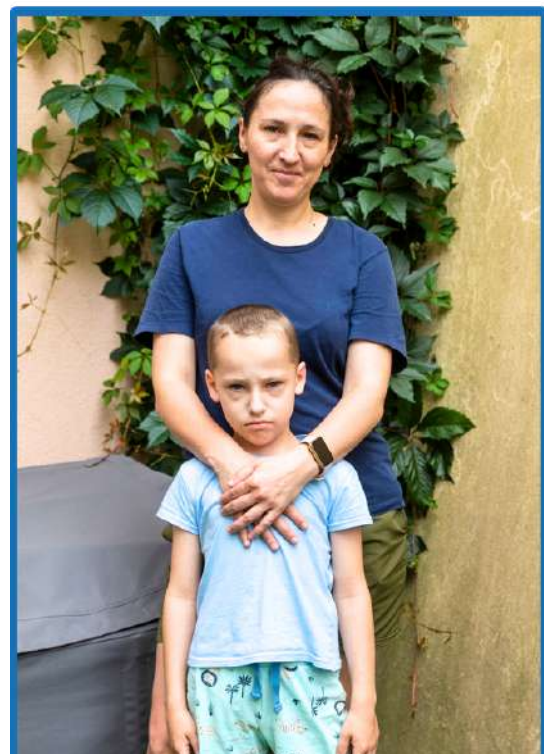




Pastoral Family Care Foundaion (PFCF) is a mature humanitarian organization operating at the **Polish-Ukrainian border in Przemyśl**, in a context of prolonged war, geopolitical instability, and deep uncertainty about the future of millions affected by the conflict. With no clear perspective for an end to the war in Ukraine, **the need for long-term, structured humanitarian support remains critical.**



Today, PFCF operates as a **stable provider of comprehensive, long-term assistance, running an official collective accommodation center (OZZ)** and delivering integrated support to some of the most vulnerable groups: elderly people, individuals with chronic illnesses or disabilities, and single mothers with children. Our work is grounded in **accountability, operational continuity, and measurable results**, ensuring that humanitarian assistance goes beyond emergency response and contributes to dignity, stability, and self-reliance.



This report outlines how PFCF is **transitioning from crisis response to a durable, future-oriented humanitarian infrastructure**—built to operate responsibly, independently, and at scale.

COMMUNITY KITCHEN & SOCIAL ENTREPRISE



At this stage of organizational development, **PFCF is focused on strengthening its long-term resilience.** In response to an unpredictable funding environment and ongoing geopolitical risks, we are implementing a strategic diversification of our financial model. **A key pillar of this strategy is the launch of a social enterprise-based catering activity, designed to generate sustainable income, create employment opportunities (including for refugees), and reinvest all surplus directly into humanitarian programs.**

By supporting us, you help those most in need.

Income generated through this activity will partially support the operation of the Humanitarian Aid Center while creating **employment opportunities for its residents and other individuals facing social and economic exclusion.**



Why the Kitchen Renovation is Crucial

The current kitchen infrastructure at the Center requires **comprehensive modernization.** Without renovation, it is not possible to operate a professional food production facility or develop catering services in compliance with sanitary and food safety standards.

The planned project includes:

- comprehensive renovation and modernization of the kitchen infrastructure
- adaptation of the facilities to meet professional gastronomic and sanitary standards
- installation of professional catering and kitchen equipment
- creation of a functional workspace for preparing meals both for residents and for catering services

The objective is to establish a fully operational production kitchen that will serve as the backbone of both the foundation's social mission and its economic activities.



Social Impact of the Project

A modern kitchen will not only improve meal preparation for the residents of the Center but will also enable the **creation of a social catering enterprise.**

This initiative will:

- create employment opportunities and vocational internships for refugees and people at risk of social exclusion
- provide professional training and skills development in the gastronomy sector
- generate income that will support the humanitarian and social activities of the foundation
- increase the financial sustainability of the Humanitarian Aid Center

By combining humanitarian assistance with economic activity, the project supports long-term social integration and empowerment rather than short-term aid alone.

Scope of the Investment

The project includes:

- Renovation of the Kitchen Infrastructure (**150 000 USD**)
- 5 full- time employment contracts (one year long) for refugees (**100 000 USD**)
- Modernization of installations, work surfaces, and kitchen facilities to ensure compliance with professional catering standards.
- Purchase and Installation of Gastronomic Equipment
- Acquisition of professional kitchen equipment that will enable food preparation on a larger scale.
- Development of Catering Facilities
- Creation of a functional kitchen space capable of providing catering services for events, institutions, and the local community.

The total estimated cost of the kitchen modernization and 5 employment contracts is **~1,000,000 PLN (~250 000 USD)**, including renovation works, materials, employment contracts, and professional equipment.



Supporting the renovation of the kitchen at the PFCF Humanitarian Aid Center is more than a one-time donation.

It is an investment in a solution that will create long-term social impact



The renovated kitchen will become a long-term asset for the community, serving residents of the Center as well as local partners and institutions.

Installation of a Passenger Lift in the Building



To improve accessibility and ensure safe movement within the Humanitarian Aid Center, our project includes the installation of a passenger lift connecting the 4 different floors of the building, improving accessibility and mobility within the building.



The estimated cost of the installation of the passenger lift is **500,000 PLN (~ 150 000 USD)**, including construction works, structural adjustments, installation, and safety systems.
